Invitation to Confession:

One: Friends, we confess because honesty keeps a church alive. We do not come to recite perfect words—we come to tell the truth about our imperfect lives. Confession helps us notice what needs healing, name what has grown tangled, and remember who we are meant to be. We confess together because church is where private truth becomes shared healing. We confess so that, through shared accountability, we can reset and turn back toward grace—trusting always that God longs to welcome and receive us.

Unison Prayer of Confession:

**All: God of stability and truth, we bring you the real story of our lives and our world. We confess that we have hurried when we could have paused, turned away from suffering we could have faced, and closed our hearts to voices you were asking us to hear. Forgive what has grown tangled in us—habits that ignore our neighbors, fears that protect only our comfort, and pride that forgets the common good. Help us to hold one another in mercy and to learn a better road together. Inspire us once again to become the church you imagine: honest in speech, patient in love, playful in hope, courageous in growth, and faithful in seeking justice. Amen.**

Scriptures:

*Exodus 24:12-18*

The Lord said to Moses, "Come up to me on the mountain, and wait there; and I will give you the tables of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction." 
